PROCESS GROUP

Module 1

Initiation (13%)

The first phase in the Project Management Life Cycle is the initiation phase. The project objectives, scope, purpose and deliverables to be produced are detailed and documented. Preliminary analysis is also carried out to identify all stakeholders involved in the project.

Module 2

Planning (24%)

Following initiation, various tasks necessary to complete the work are listed and grouped into a work breakdown structure. Project planning involves organizing different areas of a project, including project plans, workloads and the management of teams and individuals.

Module 3

Execution (31%)

The Execution Phase is the third stage in the cycle of a project. This stage involves building the deliverables of the project and then presenting them to the client for signoff. It is usually the longest phase, which means that typically, it consumes the most energy of all the phases and the most resources. For monitoring and controlling the project during this phase, the project manager will need to implement a range of management processes to help manage time, cost, quality, change, risks and issues affecting the project.

Module 4

Monitoring and Controlling (25%)

The monitoring and controlling stage comprises of the various activities involved after implementation, identifying problems and risks, as well as deploying a mitigation strategy to control the new process. Monitoring and controlling phase and the execution phase are separate phases are conducted simultaneously. The main aim of purpose for monitoring and controlling processes is to ensure that the project team to identify potential risks that require corrective measures. Early identification of issues allows the project team to be more proactive in mitigating risks.

Module 5

Closing (7%)

This phase is the last stage of a project cycle that officially signifies the finish and close of all the assignments in a project. The project team conclude, by getting the approval and transferring project deliverables to the client. The importance of this stage is that all the stakeholders come together and unanimously agree that the project has met its designated goals and objectives, and additional resources cannot be assigned to the project.
